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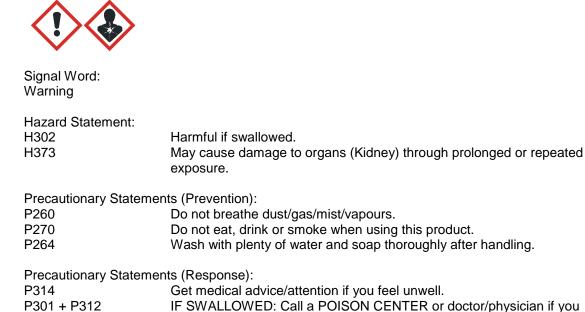

#### **SECTION 4: First-Aid Measures**

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

Immediately remove contaminated clothing. If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position). First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety.

If inhaled: Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention.

On skin contact: Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention.

On contact with eyes: Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open.

#### Irritation

Experimental/calculated data: Skin corrosion/irritation rabbit: non-irritant

#### Respiratory/Skin sensitization

Assessment of sensitization: Based on the ingredients, there is no suspicion of a skin-sensitizing potential.

Developmental toxicity

Information on: ethanediol; ethylene glycol Assessment of teratogenicity: Developmental toxicity was observed after oral ingestion of high doses in studies with rats and mice, but this effect was not seen in a study with rabbits. Mechanistic studies show that the rabbit is the relevant species for the classification for human health. As such, and since ethylene glycol is not a developmental toxicant in the rabbit, no classification is warranted.

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Specific target organ toxicity (single exposure)
